The decrease in the Out Islands primarily came from San Salvador which saw a -92.5% drop as a result of Hurricane Joaquin which passed through some of the islands in the Bahamas in October 2015. Hurricane Joaquin caused Club Med to close for a few months and the airport on the island was still under repair in January 2016. Additionally decreases can be seen in Long Island and Inagua both of which were impacted by Hurricane Joaquin. The re-building on islands affected by the hurricane still continued into January 2016.

The One and Only Ocean Club on PI. closed for repairs as a result of Hurricane Matthew and the Sandals Royal Bahamian Resort which had closed in September did not reopen as early in October 2016 as originally planned. The Sandals Emerald Isle Resort in Exuma also closed as a result of Hurricane Matthew and was scheduled to re-open by mid December 2016. The Memories Resort in Grand Bahama also closed as a result of Hurricane Matthew and the Grand Celebration which normally cruises to Grand Bahama every other day, was rerouted to Bimini instead of GBI because of the ravishes left behind by Hurricane Matthew and as a result of the hurricane damage sustained, was not in full operation in November and December 2016. Sea arrivals namely cruise arrivals to the Bahamas were slow in the 1st qtr. of 2016 but began to show significant improvements in the 2nd quarter of 2016. In 2nd Qtr. 2016, Cruise arrivals to the Bahamas were slow in the 1st qtr. of 2016 but began to show significant improvements in the 2nd quarter of 2016. In 2nd Qtr. 2016, Cruise arrivals (which help to make up sea arrivals) by 1st port of entry grew by 5.9%. Most of this growth in cruise arrivals occurred in New Providence. In 3rd Qtr. 2016, cruise arrivals (1st port of entry) grew by 11.9% and this further helped to bolster sea arrival growth to New Providence. In 4th Qtr. 2016, Hurricane Matthew significantly impacted cruise arrivals to Grand Bahama and some of the Qut Islands but the lost of cruise business to those islands was counteracted by an increase in cruise business to New Providence which was not hit as severely by the hurricane as the other islands so despite the hurricane, cruise business to the Bahamas in 4th qtr. still grew to New Providence (1st port of entry). By the end of 2016, cruise arrivals were up by 3.9% (1st Port of entry) and contributed significantly to the 3.2% increase in overall sea arrivals to the Bahamas during the year.
