Hurricane Joaquin passed through some of the islands of the Bahamas in October 2015.

Hurricane Joaquin caused Club Med to close for a few months including January 2016 and the airport on the island was still under repair by this month. This meant that the number of air arrivals into San Salvador in January 2016 was low compared to the number of air arrivals in January 2017.

In October 2016, Hurricane Matthew passed through the Islands of the Bahamas but it did not hit

San Salvador directly and therefore in January 2017, Club Med was not closed like it had been in January 2016.

Hurricane Matthew passed through New Providence, Grand Bahama, and some of the other islands of the Bahamas between October 5-8,

2016 and caused hotel closures in Nassau/P.I., Grand Bahama Isl., Exuma and other islands. The One and Only Ocean Club on P.I. Closed for repairs as a result of Hurricane Matthew and the Sandals Royal Bahamian Resort which had closed in September did not reopen as early in October 2016 as originally planned. The Sandals Emerald Isle Resort in Exuma also closed as a result of Hurricane Matthew and was scheduled to re-open by mid December 2016. The Memories Resort in Grand Bahama also closed as a result of Hurricane Matthew and the Grand Celebration which normally cruises to Grand Bahama every other day, was rerouted to Bimini instead of GBI because of the ravishes left behind by Hurricane Matthew in October 2016. The Grand Lucayan Resort in Grand Bahama was open for only a few days in October 2016 prior to Hurricane Matthew and as a result of the hurricane damage sustained, was not in full operation in November and December 2016.

Some islands like Grand Bahama and Bimini did not sustain direct hits from the hurricane but were severely affected by tornados that spun out as a result of Hurricane Irma as that storm approached Florida.

Hurricane Maria passed close to the Southern Islands of the Bahamas and near the Turks and Caicos Islands on September 22, 2017. It travelled through and near to the Caribbean between September 18th to 25th, 2017. Hurricane Jose stayed in the Atlantic Ocean but meandered off the coast of some of the Caribbean islands September 9th to September 17, 2017.

and caused hotel closures in Nassau/P.I., Grand Bahama Isl., Exuma and other islands. The One and Only Ocean Club on P.I. Closed

for repairs as a result of Hurricane Matthew and the Sandals Royal Bahamian Resort which had closed in September did not reopen

as early in October 2016 as originally planned. The Sandals Emerald Isle Resort in Exuma also closed as a result of Hurricane Matthew and was scheduled to re-open by mid December 2016. The Memories Resort in Grand Bahama also closed as a result of Hurricane Matthew and the Grand Celebration which normally cruises to Grand Bahama every other day, was rerouted to Bimini instead of GBI because of the ravishes left behind by Hurricane Matthew in October 2016. The Grand Lucayan Resort in Grand Bahama was open for only a few days in October 2016 prior to Hurricane Matthew and as a result of the hurricane damage sustained, was not in full operation in November and December 2016.

Hurricane Irma passed through the Southern islands of the Bahamas on September 8th, 2017. The Lynden Pindling Airport in Nassau in the Bahamas was closed on Sept. 8th and 9th in anticipation of the storm.
