

2. How Many Visitors Came to The Bahamas in 2018?


The Bahamas received 6.622 million foreign air and sea arrivals in 2018 and 6.136 in 2017. Of these foreign air and sea arrivals (including cruise) in 2018, The Bahamas received 1.66 million <u>air</u> arrivals. Of the foreign air and sea arrivals to The Bahamas in 2018, Nassau/Paradise Island received most of the visitors. More than half (57.0%, 3.8 million) of the foreign air and sea arrivals in 2018 came to Nassau/Paradise Island. The Out Islands received 30.0% (2.2 million) of the arrivals and Grand Bahama received 10.1% (670,745 thousand) of the arrivals.

3. Which Island in The Bahamas Received the Most Stopover Visitors?

Nassau/Paradise Island received the most stopover visitors. In 2018, approximately seven in every ten (72%) stopover visitors to The Bahamas visited Nassau/Paradise Island, 8% visited Grand Bahama, and 20% visited the Out Islands.

4. Where Did the Stopover Visitors to The Bahamas Come From (2018)?

In 2018, approximately eight and ten (79.9%) stopover visitors to The Bahamas came from the United States, 7.7% of them came from Canada, the second biggest supplier of visitors to The Bahamas, and 7.5% of them came from Europe. In 2018, Europe was the 3rd largest supplier of stopover visitors to The Bahamas and the UK was the top producing market from this region. Approximately two percent (2.1%) of stopovers came from Latin America, 1.3% from the Caribbean, and 1.5% from the rest of the world.

In 2018, stopover visitor arrivals were up from the USA (13.9%), Canada (13.9%), Europe (4.8%) and the rest of the world (4.8%). In 2018, stopovers were down from Latin America (-2.1%), and the Caribbean (-0.5%).

In 2018, stopover visitor arrivals from Canada were up by 13.9% for the year compared to 2017. Stopover arrivals to The Bahamas from Canada increased from Ontario (18.4%), Quebec (2.5%), Alberta (15.6%), British Columbia (17.8%), Nova Scotia (4.4%), Saskatchewan (5.1%), and Newfoundland and Labrador (0.6%). Stopovers declined from Manitoba (-36.1%) and New Brunswick (-2.2%) during the period.

In 2018, stopover arrivals to The Bahamas from Latin America decreased by 2% compared to 2017. The Bahamas did experience growth from some of the Latin American countries like Colombia, Chile, Panama, Peru, Ecuador, Honduras, Nicaragua, and Bolivia but it was not enough to counter the fall from the other countries.

10. Which Months Are the Slowest for Visitor Arrivals to the Bahamas?

September and October are the slowest months for stopover arrivals to visit The Bahamas.

11. Which Months Are the Busiest Months for Visitor Arrivals to The Bahamas?

March is historically the busiest month for stopover visitor arrivals to The Bahamas but on occasion July has been the busiest. In 2018, March was the busiest month. March is the month when many spring breakers converge on the islands for their escape from their various Colleges and Universities. In addition, the Easter Holiday often falls in either March or April and this holiday has always been popular for stopovers to visit The Bahamas.

The busiest period for stopover visitors to come to The Bahamas is between the months of March to the end of August. The month of December has also been a good month for stopovers to visit.

12. Which Months Are the Busiest Months for Stopover Arrivals to the Bahamas From the United States?

The months of March through August are usually the busiest months from the US and September and October the slowest.

Stopover Arrivals from the United States tended to peak in March historically prior to 2009. Since 2009 after the financial meltdown, the summer month of July has often been busier than March for US stopovers to The Bahamas.

In 2018 however, March was the busiest month for stopover arrivals to The Bahamas from the United States.

13. Which Months Are the Busiest Months for Stopovers From Canada?

Stopover Arrivals to The Bahamas from Canada in any given year are normally highest in the winter months of November thru April (i.e. November, December, January, February, March, and April) which are usually the coldest months in Canada.

14. Which Months Are the Busiest Months for Stopovers From Europe?

Prior to 2010, the month of August was unequivocally the most popular month for Europeans to visit The Bahamas, but that pattern has shifted somewhat. The month of April was the most popular month for Europeans to visit between 2017 to 2018.

15. How Much Money Did Visitors Spend In The Bahamas?

In 2018, stopover, cruise and day visitors spent \$3.7 billion in the Bahamian Economy compared to \$2.9 billion in 2017.

16. Why Did Visitors Come to The Bahamas?

Roughly three in every four (75%) stopover visitors came to The Bahamas for a vacation, 6% for a honeymoon, 5% of them on a business trip and 3% to visit friends & relatives.

17. What Did Visitors Say Influenced Their Decision to Visit The Bahamas?

Stopovers were influenced to visit The Bahamas because of the beaches (68% of them), climate (53%) and rest & relaxation (46%) that they expected to do on the islands.

Stopover visitors to Nassau/Paradise Island (11%) were also more influenced to visit by the casinos than those to Grand Bahama (2%) and the Out Islands (1%). For Grand Bahama, good package deals and the perception that they would receive the best value for money used to be big influences for stopovers to the island prior to 2017 when the Memories Resort was on the island. The Memories Resort closed after Hurricane Matthew caused extensive damage to the property in October 2016. Other major influences for stopover visitors to the Out Islands included friendly people (34%), the perceived safety of the islands (26%), the perception that the Islands were exotic (21%), and sports (23%).

18. What Activities Did Visitors Say They Wanted to Do While in The Bahamas?

Stopover visitors to The Bahamas had a few activities in mind that they wanted to do before they arrived. Activities that visitors wanted to do included: enjoy beaches (86% of them), rest & relax (73%), snorkel (34%), shop (26%), go to the casino (20%), and go on an island tour (19%).

19. How Many Visitors Have Been to The Bahamas Before?

In 2018, more than half (56%) of stopover visitors to The Bahamas had visited before. More than half of the visitors to Nassau/Paradise Island (54%), and Grand Bahama (56%) had visited the Bahamas before. Roughly two in every three (65%) stopover visitors to the Out Islands had visited The Bahamas before. The percentage of repeat visitors to the Out Islands has always been high.

20. How Many Visitors Said That They Were Likely to Return to The Bahamas in 1-5 years (2018)?

Eighty-six percent (86%) of stopover visitors to The Bahamas Overall said that they were likely to return, compared to 85% of those to Nassau/Paradise, 81% to Grand Bahama Island, and 91% to the Out Islands.

21. How Many Visitors Said That They Were Likely to Recommend The Bahamas to their friends and relatives (2018)?

The majority (94%) of stopovers to The Bahamas Overall said that they were likely to recommend the destination to friends and relatives, 94% of those to Nassau/Paradise Island, 91% of those to Grand Bahama Island and 97% of the stopovers to the Out Islands said this.

22. What is Tourism?

Tourism: The "activities of persons traveling to and staying in places outside their usual environment for not more than one consecutive year for leisure, business and other purposes not related to the exercise of an activity remunerated (i.e. without receiving a salary/wage for said activity/activities) from within the place visited." (Source: United Nations World Tourism Organization UNWTO, & *Wikipedia, The Free Encyclopedia*).

TYPE OF VISITORS

Visitors to the Islands of The Bahamas can come to the Bahamas by air or by sea.

Air arrivals are persons that come to the destination by air and include: stopover visitors, day visitors, & transits.

Sea arrivals are persons that come to the destination by sea and include: cruise arrivals, cruise stopover visitors and boaters/yachters.

Stopover/Stayover Visitors are travelers that travel outside of their normal environment for any purpose other than to be employed by a resident entity, and stay in the destination for 24 hours or more but less than a year. Some examples of stopover visitors include persons that stay in hotels, private boats/yachts, vacation rentals, timeshares, etc.

<u>**Cruise Stopover Visitors**</u> are a special category of stopovers that come to the destination on a cruise ship but get off and stay in other land-based or other accommodations upon arrival.

<u>**Cruise Visitors**</u> are travelers that travel outside of their normal environment on a cruise ship for any purpose other than to be employed by a resident entity and use the ship for their accommodations.

Day Visitors are travelers that travel outside of their normal environment for any purpose other than to be employed by a resident entity and stay in the destination for less than 24 hours.

Transits are persons that are simply passing through a country/destination on their way to somewhere else.
